Two hundred and eighty five Pounds on a Range of buildings, communicating, used as a part the Workhouse, situate in Cheadle aforesaid, and in the east side of the Yards belonging thereto.
Brick, Tiled and Slated.

Five Pounds on a Coal-house, near the above.
Brick and Slated.

Ten Pounds on a building consisting of a Washing Room, a foul room and a fumigating room, all communicating, near the above.
Brick and Slated.

Two Hundred Pounds on another range of buildings adjoining used as a part of the said Workhouse and Offices, and situate on the west and north side of the Yards aforesaid.
Brick and Slated.

Warranted that no hazardous trade shall be carried on, and that no hazardous Goods shall be deposited in the aforesaid Premises.
